Our History and Mission

"To advocate for and provide the resources, skills, and shelter to alleviate abuse through prevention and intervention for all children and their families."

Manatee Children's Services was founded in 1977 by Carol Chamberlain: a librarian, teacher, and social worker with a passion for child advocacy. Through her work in social services, Carol learned that Manatee County had a dire need for shelter to house abused children removed from their homes. She rallied a group of citizens to make the shelter a reality and, to this day, MCS continues to operate as Manatee County's only emergency shelter for child victims of abuse and the county's only Child Advocacy Center.

We provide a full spectrum of programs serving over 12,000 children and families annually. We offer programs in treatment, prevention, intervention, and residential services. Such programs include an emergency shelter, long-term group homes, mental health services, parenting education and training, forensic medical and specialized child victim interview services, support services for relative caregivers, teen pregnancy prevention, and children's personal safety. Sherri Mills: Live2Give Foundation

Sherri Mills, Michael Saunders & Company Realtor, decided to make a difference in a big way after recovering from debilitating pain and being given a second chance at life. In 2019, she created the "Live2Give" Facebook group for creating kindness and sharing ideas on how to give back to the community. What Sherri envisioned as a small group of people with a common vision turned into something much more: there are now hundreds of Live2Givers with members from all over the world.



When COVID struck, members noticed some dire community needs as a result of the pandemic and asked Sherri to transform Live2Give into a nonprofit so they could collect donations and give tax-deductible receipts. Since then, Sherri said Live2Givers fill in the gap when nonprofits have short-term emergency needs. Sherri's personal commitment to giving back is to donate a portion of her commission from each real estate transaction to a charity that focuses on trauma and abuse, one of which is MCS. Since 2020, she has given about \$225,000 to three charities focused on helping others overcome trauma and abuse.

"I believe that, in general, hurt people hurt others and that the key to having a kinder, gentler world is to help people over the trauma and abuse they have experienced," Sherri said.


Sherri discovered MCS through the Longboat Key Chamber and soon thereafter, met our "dynamic, passionate, and impressive" CEO, Melinda Thompson. After witnessing the consequences of child abuse as a former special education teacher and parenting educator, she felt especially compelled to help.

"MCS's mission resonates to me deeply as a survivor and as a mother," Sherri said. "No child should experience child abuse but unfortunately, it happens. And when it does, MCS is there to provide alternatives for children to be in a safe environment. To me, they are at ground zero for saving children and I can't think of a higher calling. It is an honor to be one of their many, devoted supporters."
