Our History and Mission

"To advocate for and provide the resources, skills, and shelter to alleviate abuse through prevention and intervention for all children and their families."

Manatee Children's Services was founded in 1977 by Carol Chamberlain: a librarian, teacher, and social worker with a passion for child advocacy. Through her work in social services, Carol learned that Manatee County had a dire need for shelter to house abused children removed from their homes. She rallied a group of citizens to make the shelter a reality and, to this day, MCS continues to operate as Manatee County's only emergency shelter for child victims of abuse and the county's only Child Advocacy Center.

We provide a full spectrum of programs serving over 12,000 children and families annually. We offer programs in treatment, prevention, intervention, and residential services. Such programs include an emergency shelter, long-term group homes, mental health services, parenting education and training, forensic medical and specialized child victim interview services, support services for relative caregivers, teen pregnancy prevention, and children's personal safety. 



VCN QUILTING & SEWING MINISTRY

The VCN Quilting & Sewing Ministry, led by Susy Sircy, began in January 2011. Their mission is "Spreading love, warmth, and friendship through the distribution of lap covers and other handmade items."

After hearing MCS children and families were in need of covers, VCN delivered their first donation in June 2020.

"When we heard about things that were needed to help the quality of life of the clients at MCS, we decided that VCN would make a quarterly contribution to include handmade items such as covers and toys, along with hygiene items, arts and crafts, journals, clothing, gift bags, and more," Susy said. "Plans are always in the works so that we know what their needs will be for the next quarter."

Their handmade items have been a big hit with the children we serve. One particular mother, whose 10-yearold son is a huge baseball fan, reported that her son immediately wrapped his baseball themed quilt from VCN around himself with nothing but smiles and wouldn't take it off. She said the quilters' kindness made a huge difference to her son and her family.

The VCN quilters also serve individuals, nursing homes, assisted living facilities, maternity wards, and independent homes throughout the community. They have even sent covers and knitted hats to disaster-stricken areas as far as Mississippi and Kentucky.

"We are so blessed to have such talented and dedicated ladies that make up the VCN Ministry," Susy said.
