Our History and Mission

"To advocate for and provide the resources, skills, and shelter to alleviate abuse through prevention and intervention for all children and their families."

Manatee Children's Services was founded in 1977 by Carol Chamberlain: a librarian, teacher, and social worker with a passion for child advocacy. Through her work in social services, Carol learned that Manatee County had a dire need for shelter to house abused children removed from their homes. She rallied a group of citizens to make the shelter a reality and, to this day, MCS continues to operate as Manatee County's only emergency shelter for child victims of abuse and the county's only Child Advocacy Center.

We provide a full spectrum of programs serving over 12,000 children and families annually. We offer programs in treatment, prevention, intervention, and residential services. Such programs include an emergency shelter, long-term group homes, mental health services, parenting education and training, forensic medical and specialized child victim interview services, support services for relative caregivers, teen pregnancy prevention, and children's personal safety. OUR CARING COMMUNITY



We are so excited to share two important grant awards in the month of November!

Thanks to the Manatee Community Foundation, we received \$10,800 for a new security camera system at the MCS Emergency Shelter and long-term group homes, which will allow us to more thoroughly monitor at-risk children for safety hazards.

The Bishop-Parker Foundation awarded MCS with \$27,820 to support our Spanish-Speaking Non-Offending Caregivers (NOC) program, a series of evidence-based group therapy sessions to provide caregivers with the tools to support children in their care after abuse.


Thank you to both foundations for your ongoing support of our services that break the cycle of child abuse.

COMMUNITY SPOTLIGHT OF THE MONTH



We'd like to recognize a longtime supporter of MCS: the staff of Commercial Plastering USA, LLC. Established in 1976, their specialties are ornamental work, schools, and high-rise buildings. In fact, they are locally famous for their plastering work at the Ringling Museum for the past 40 years.

The organization became part of our giving community 25 years ago by helping raise money to build our residential foster homes. Commercial Plastering President, Billy Rice, has also taken MCS children on field trips and purchased a van for staff to transport them.

"Growing up in the environment that I did, MCS has always been dear to my heart," Billy said. "I know how it feels to be in their shoes.. Unfortunately, they have to depend on help from someone, and MCS provides that help for them."

The staff at Commercial Plastering also make a difference in our community every day through their work with Suncoast Children's Charities, the Safe Children's Coalition Angel Tree program, and Women's Resource Center. In addition, they helped tear down the original school on Anna Maria Island and build the first community center in its place.

"Children are our future and we as a society need to help these kids have a successful future," Billy said. "The saying goes, 'It takes a village to raise children' and this is never truer than with these kids that are at risk and those that have endured abuse and neglect."
