#### Our History and Mission

"To advocate for and provide the resources, skills, and shelter to alleviate abuse through prevention and intervention for all children and their families."

Manatee Children's Services was founded in 1977 by Carol Chamberlain: a librarian, teacher, and social worker with a passion for child advocacy. Through her work in social services, Carol learned that Manatee County had a dire need for shelter to house abused children removed from their homes. She rallied a group of citizens to make the shelter a reality and, to this day, MCS continues to operate as Manatee County's only emergency shelter for child victims of abuse and the county's only Child Advocacy Center.

We provide a full spectrum of programs serving over 12,000 children and families annually. We offer programs in treatment, prevention, intervention, and residential services. Such programs include an emergency shelter, long-term group homes, mental health services, parenting education and training, forensic medical and specialized child victim interview services, support services for relative caregivers, teen pregnancy prevention, and children's personal safety. 

### **COMMUNITY SPOTLIGHT**



The Rosedale community is home to two thriving women's golf leagues, each offering members an opportunity to connect through their shared love of the game. The Rosedale Ladies Golf Association (RLGA, pictured above left) is an 18-hole league with approximately 80 members, while the Rosedale Niners Golf Association (RNGA, pictures above right) is a 9-hole league with around 60 members. Both leagues are nonprofit organizations dedicated to fostering sportsmanship, fellowship, and friendly competition among their members. Each league operates under its own constitution and bylaws, offering weekly competitive golf events, special tournaments, and social gatherings. They also promote the knowledge and application of the United States Golf Association (USGA) Rules of Golf, ensuring members grow in their understanding and enjoyment of the sport.

Beyond the fairways and greens, these leagues have made a meaningful impact in the community through their long-standing commitment to helping children in need during the holiday season. Over a decade ago, RLGA and RNGA came together to form a joint "Project Outreach" committee, uniting their efforts to sponsor and support local children in the MCS Holiday Project.

In the project's early years, members organized gifts for children and invited them to the Rosedale golf course for a special day where the children enjoyed lunch, golf cart rides, and putting on the practice green. Each child was paired with a league member who presented them with gifts from their holiday wish list. Many members still cherish these heartwarming memories of bringing joy to the children. Today, the tradition continues with a slightly updated format. Members receive a list of children in need from MCS, choose a child, and contribute gift cards. These cards are then given to the children's caregivers, allowing them to shop for personalized holiday gifts.

The RLGA and RNGA's dedication to spreading holiday cheer exemplifies the spirit of generosity and community. Their ongoing support of MCS reflects their belief that giving back is as integral to their mission as the game of golf itself. We celebrate and thank the women of RLGA and RNGA for their incredible commitment to making the holidays brighter for children in need. They are true role models for the power of community and the joy of giving.
