Our History and Mission

"To advocate for and provide the resources, skills, and shelter to alleviate abuse through prevention and intervention for all children and their families."

Manatee Children's Services was founded in 1977 by Carol Chamberlain: a librarian, teacher, and social worker with a passion for child advocacy. Through her work in social services, Carol learned that Manatee County had a dire need for shelter to house abused children removed from their homes. She rallied a group of citizens to make the shelter a reality and, to this day, MCS continues to operate as Manatee County's only emergency shelter for child victims of abuse and the county's only Child Advocacy Center.

We provide a full spectrum of programs serving over 12,000 children and families annually. We offer programs in treatment, prevention, intervention, and residential services. Such programs include an emergency shelter, long-term group homes, mental health services, parenting education and training, forensic medical and specialized child victim interview services, support services for relative caregivers, teen pregnancy prevention, and children's personal safety. 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






MCS in the Community

This May, we celebrated a month of generosity that's bringing meaningful change to the children and families we serve every day.

We're thrilled to share that the Bishop-Parker Foundation has awarded us \$60,000 to purchase a dual-purpose vehicle for our residential campus. This hardworking addition will help our maintenance team keep our facilities safe and sound and transport foster children to school, appointments, and more. It's more than a vehicle: it's a bridge to stability, support, and daily care.

Thanks to the Service Club of Manatee County, a generous gift of \$12,500 will provide three months of meals for all 12 children living in our Emergency Shelter. That's breakfast, lunch, dinner, and snacks served with love, and the security that comes with knowing every child will be nourished and cared for.

With a \$2,500 grant from the Community Foundation of Sarasota County, we'll be partnering with fundraising consultant Tracy Vanderneck of Phil-Com LLC to create a fundraising plan and strengthen our long-term development program. This investment will help us grow our impact and connect with even more compassionate supporters.

MCS SUCCESS STORIES



At MCS, we know change takes time, trust, and support. BRIC program Parenting Specialist, Becky Blanco, recently shared a powerful success story that reminds us why this work matters so deeply.

Becky worked closely with a mom and dad who were struggling with emotional regulation, communication, and empathy, especially when it came to supporting their child's mental health and unique identity. At the beginning of the parenting program, both parents were guarded and resistant, firmly rooted in their own beliefs and unsure of how to connect with their child in meaningful ways. But by the fifth session, something remarkable began to happen.

The parents started opening up and began to share their own emotions and challenges, not only with Becky but with each other. They practiced using the tools and strategies discussed in sessions: tools focused on empathy, communication, and healthy emotional responses. Dad, once quick to yell in frustration, started to reflect before reacting. By the end of the program, he proudly shared that he no longer resorted to yelling; instead, he approached his children with calm and patience, meeting them where they were emotionally. Mom, too, learned to connect with her child through effective, compassionate communication. Together, they built a new foundation for their family: one rooted in respect, empathy, and genuine connection.

"This was a big win for the family," Becky shared. "The transformation in both parents was profound. They went from being stuck in their ways to becoming thoughtful, engaged, and emotionally available to their children."

Successes like these are at the heart of our mission to empower families with the tools they need to grow, heal, and thrive.

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
