Our History and Mission

Preventing child abuse, restoring healing, and strengthening all children and their families through advocacy, treatment, and shelter.

Manatee Children's Services was founded in 1977 by Carol Chamberlain: a librarian, teacher, and social worker with a passion for child advocacy. Through her work in social services, Carol learned that Manatee County had a dire need for shelter to house abused children removed from their homes. She rallied a group of citizens to make the shelter a reality and, to this day, MCS continues to operate as Manatee County's only emergency shelter for child victims of abuse and the county's only Child Advocacy Center.


We provide a full spectrum of programs serving over 12,000 children and families annually. We offer programs in treatment, prevention, intervention, and residential services. Such programs include an emergency shelter, long-term group homes, mental health services, parenting education and training, forensic medical and specialized child victim interview services, support services for relative caregivers, teen pregnancy prevention, and children's personal safety. 

Thanks to the Community Foundation of Sarasota County Suncoast Disaster Recovery Fund, we restored our campus landscaping and security lighting damaged by last year's Hurricane Milton. We are so grateful for the ability to bring back its safety and beauty!

We are deeply appreciative to the Bishop Parker Foundation for their generous \$30,000 grant, which supports critical improvements to our main building, including a new HVAC system, soffit, gutters, fascia repairs, and exterior doors. COMMUNITY SPOTLIGHT



For more than a century, the Bradenton Woman's Club (BWC) has been a cornerstone of service in Manatee County. Founded in 1913 by a small group of 16 local women committed to making a difference, the Club has grown into a dynamic 501(c)(3) organization guided by the motto "Unity in Diversity" and the spirit of volunteerism. Their historic clubhouse, built in 1921 and now listed on the National Register of Historic Places, stands as a symbol of their long-standing commitment to community improvement.

BWC's mission focuses on enhancing lives through service, with members from diverse backgrounds united by a shared desire to create positive change. As part of the General Federation of Women's Clubs, BWC supports initiatives in education, civic engagement, health and wellness, and social services: especially those benefiting women, children, and veterans.

The Club partners with a wide range of local organizations, providing volunteer support, monetary contributions, and in-kind donations to address critical needs such as education access, food insecurity, and family stability. This year, BWC extended that generosity to MCS, recently supporting our annual Holiday Project.

BWC's support of MCS reflects a shared commitment to protecting children and strengthening families. As community needs continue to grow — particularly around child safety, mental health, and economic hardship — the Bradenton Woman's Club remains a powerful example of how collective compassion and service can create lasting impact.

We are deeply grateful for their partnership and dedication to making our community stronger for generations to come.

STAFF AND PROGRAM TESTIMONIALS

For nearly 26 years, one dedicated staff member has been part of the heart of MCS: Jocina Newsome.

She didn't begin her career planning to work in child services, but once she walked through our doors, everything changed. Starting as a foster care advocate, she was exposed to realities many never see. Her commitment to protecting children only deepened.

Today, she supervises four prevention programs serving youth, caregivers, and families before crises escalate. These programs support teens navigating relationships and online safety, elementary students learning personal safety, at-risk youth in need of early intervention, and grandparents and relatives who suddenly step into parenting roles.



The last program, "Grandparents as Parents," holds a special place in her heart. She remembers a grandmother who had recently lost both her husband and daughter and suddenly found herself raising two young grandchildren. Through patient listening, connection to grief counseling, and ongoing support, the family found stability and hope. Today, the children are thriving, and the grandmother still walks through our doors with a smile.

After more than two decades, she remains because prevention matters, listening changes outcomes, and sometimes sitting with someone when their world is falling apart is what keeps a family standing.
